Topics include occupation in daily life; education and functions of the OT practitioner; frames of reference and occupational therapy models; occupational therapy personnel educational roles and functions; current health care management environment including OT practice areas; moral legal and ethical issues; communication in OT including medical terminology and service documentation. Prerequisite: Admission into the OTA program.
